

## 14DAYS- OVER ASIA

Bangkok-Siem Reap-Vientiane-Luang Prabang-Hanoi

### Day1. Arrival Bangkok

Upon arrival, meet & greet at the airport then transfer to the hotel. After check in, free & relax on own. Overnight in Bangkok

### Day2. City Temple Tour – Royal Grand Palace & Emerald Buddha

(B, L)

Breakfast at hotel and then sightseeing tour to visit: At first visit to Wat Traimit, the Temple of the Golden Buddha, the temple is famous for its 900-years old five-and-a-half-ton solid gold image, and then continue to visit Wat Arun, perhaps better known as the Temple of the Dawn, is one of the best known landmarks and one of the most published images of Bangkok. After that, visit to Wat Po, the largest and oldest temple in Bangkok, as well as the largest single Buddha image: the Reclining Buddha (Phra Buddhasaiyas), also known as Wat Phra Chetuphon or The Temple of the Reclining Buddha. The temple is also known as the birthplace of traditional Thai massage Reclining Buddha. Lunch on own, after lunch, we continue to visit the most famous tourist places in Bangkok, Royal Grand Palace and Emerald Buddha. The Grand Palace adjoins Wat Phra Kaew in a common compound, and is where you will end up after exiting Wat Phra Kaew. Despite the proximity of the two, there's a distinct contrast in style between the very Thai Wat Phra Kaew and the more European inspired designs of the Grand Palace (the roof being the exception). After this place we back to the hotel and free at leisure. Overnight in Bangkok



### Day3. Bangkok - Ayuthaya - Cruise Down to Bangkok

After breakfast, pick up at the hotel and depart for Ayutthaya by air-conditioned bus, Ayutthaya the former capital city of Thailand. The first places you visit is Bang Pa-In Summer Palace one of the most beautiful Summer Palace of Thailand then follow by Wat Yai Chaimongkhon where you have a chance to sacred one of the biggest Reclining Buddha Image as well and the ruins of the old Royal Grand Palace & Temples. At noon, transfer to the Pier for Cruising down the Chao Phraya River to Bangkok. Certainly, along the River you will have impress & enjoy the rural Thai life along the River. Lunch on board with many varieties of Thai / Inter delicious Buffet. At around 4 pm.

you will be picked up and transfer to hotel for leisure time. Overnight in Bangkok

### Day 4: Floating Market - Rose Garden

Today early morning, pick you up at the hotel and then transfer to one of the most attracting floating market of Thailand namely Damernsaduak Floating Market. There you have a chance to take a boat observing the lifestyle of local people along the small canals. Not only do you visit the coconut farm and taste some coconut juice but also you will find the variety of seasonal fruits such as rumbutan, mangoes, papaya and etc. Then, transfer to The Rose Garden is a scenery country resort, situated 32 Kms outside Bangkok. It consists of over 50 acres of tropical paradise flower gardens, orchards and a typical Thai Village Witness ordination into the fingernail dance, Thai Boxing, Hill tribe dancing, sword fighting, elephants at work and local fold dancing. Overnight in Bangkok.



**Day 5: BANGKOK – SIEM REAP**

After breakfast, free at leisure till time transfer to the airport for **flight departure to Siem Reap**.

You will be met at airport by professional tour guide and transferred to the hotel.

Afternoon, visit Angkor wat, the most balanced, the most harmonious, and the most perfect Khmer temple. It shows Khmer art, which reached the height of its glory in the 12th century. The temple was built by king Suryavman II and dedicated to god Vishnu. Then you will visit an amazing view of Ta prohm Temple which has been deliberately left as it was discovered. At Ta Prohm kapok trees clasp the sanctuaries in their mighty roots.

Climb Bakheng hill to have bird's-eye view of sunset, Angkor Wat and western Baray. Overnight in Siem Reap.



**Day 6: BANTEAY SREI - ANGKOR THOM**

Breakfast at the hotel

Visit Banteay Srei Temple, a tiny temple complex considered by many visitors to be the highest achievement in art and architecture of the Classic Angkor civilization. The glory of Banteay Srei is the beauty of its sculpture and decoration. The pink sandstone used in its buildings makes this temple more beautiful. On the way back to the town you will visit Banteay Samre, Built in 12th in Angkor Wat style.

Afternoon, Visit south gate of Angkor Thom with two rows of its huge statues of demons and gods depicting the churning of the ocean of milk arranged on both sides of stone bridge and Bayon temple, a forest of heads, built in late of 12th century by king Jayavarman VI as a Buddhist state temple. Then, visit terrace of elephant, which used to be a base for the king's grand audience hall; Terrace of Leper king supposed that it was a terrace housed the royal crematory.

Dinner with traditional APSARA show at local restaurant  
Overnight in Siem Reap.



**Day 7: Floating village – VIENTIANE**

(B)

Breakfast in the hotel.

Visit floating village on Tonle Sap Lake, a biggest fresh water lake in south-east Asia. Most people (90%) are fishermen living in their wooden houses built on small boats and rafts. Because of flood during rainy season they move their houses many times a year depending on water level.

Transfer to Siem Reap **airport for departure** to Vientiane.

On arrival at the airport, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Time permitting; Your half day city tour enables us to see the major temples of Vientiane including the oldest, Wat Sisaket, a temple of thousands of miniature Buddha statues, and the former royal temple of Wat Prakeo, which previously housed the famous Emerald Buddha Image. We also visit Lao national icon, That Luang Stupa, and we stop to take some pictures of the imposing Patuxay Monument, which is Vientiane's own Arc de Triumph. Overnight in Vientiane.



**Day8. Vientiane – Xiengkhuang – Plain of Jars**

(B)

You will be transferred to the airport for your flight to Xiengkhuang. Upon arrival, we transfer out to visit Site 1 of the Plain of Jars, an impressive archaeological site where hundreds of large stone jars are littered all over the plateau. You will then be transferred to your hotel for the night. Overnight in Xiengkhuang.



**Day9. Xiengkhuang – Luang Prabang**

Early morning, we visit the Central Market of Phonsavanh to watch the different hilltribe people barter and exchange merchandises. We then head out towards Luang Prabang. Enroute we stop off to see the Buddha images at Thampra, a site more than 200 years old, and various Hmong and hilltribe minority villages along the way. After numerous photo stops, we continue driving, enjoying the splendid natural scenery of the mountains, the forest and landscape. The journey will take us over mountainous regions until we approach Luang Prabang. Overnight in Luang Prabang.

**Day10. Luang Prabang – Pak Ou Caves – half day city tour**

Today, we embark on a cruise upstream on the Mekong River, which also gives us a breathtaking view of the tranquil countryside, before reaching the mysterious Pak Ou Caves, two linked caves crammed with thousands of gold lacquered Buddha statues of various shapes and sizes left by pilgrims. Along the way, we stop at the village of Ban Xanghai, where they make the local rice wine. On return, we disembark the boat to visit traditional villages, and continue taking a short drive to Ban Phanom, a village famous for its hand weaving.

In the afternoon your half day city tour begins with a visit to the Royal Palace Museum, which hosts a range of interesting artifacts. We then head to the magnificent Wat Xiengthong with its roofs sweeping low to the ground, which represents classical Laotian architecture. We also have time to visit the impressive stupa of Wat Visoun and the shrines of Wat Aham and Wat Mai.

**Day11. Luang Prabang – hanoi**

After breakfast at the hotel, transfer to **airport for departure to Hanoi**. On arrival at Noi Bai Airport, you are met and transferred to hotel. Ha Noi, Vietnam's capital is one thousand year old city with peaceful lakes, French styled buildings, old quarter streets, three lined boulevards, brightly painted temples and pagodas. Ha Noi is one of Asia's most charming cities. (If time permits) we enjoy a short cyclos ride around the the Old Quarter with 36 streets bearing names such as Rice Street, Silk Street or Paper Street to reflect the businesses originally carried on there from the 15th century. We will enjoy an evening performance by Vietnams famous water puppets. Dinner is not included.



**Day 12: HANOI - HALONG**

Breakfast at Hotel , Today we will have a good browse of Hanoi visiting Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum and former residence where the embalmed body of President Ho Chi Minh is kept, One-Pillar Pagoda which was built of wood on a single stone pillar in 1049, The Temple of Literature, the first university of Vietnam set up in 1076 to educate mandarin's sons, Hoan Kiem Lake, an enchanting body of water right in the heart of Hanoi and then, we travel by road to Ha Long Bay. Lunch and Dinner not included. Overnight in Ha Long



**Day 13: HALONG - HANOI**

Breakfast at Hotel, Ha Long Bay boasts one of Vietnam's most impressive scenic sights. This morning, we enjoy a five hour boat trip which provides a great opportunity to explore the picturesque scenery blending with the sky and some 3,000 limestone islands rising amazingly from the clear and emerald water. Along the way we will anchor for a visit the fantastic cave Thien Cung . After a seafood lunch on board we return to Ha Noi, Dinner not included. Overnight in Ha Noi.

**Day 14: HANOI – DEPARTURE**

**(B)**

Breakfast at hotel There is a free time to relax or do your own explore Hanoi city. The tour ends after your transfer to Airport for departure.
